#### What problems are we trying to solve?

- Dangerous conditions for pedestrians and bikers on 17<sup>th</sup> Street
- Neighborhood population increase, but no corresponding increase of parks
- Illegal use of Caltrans right-of-way (dumping, camping)
- 400 Block San Bruno no protection from freeway (noise, dirt, exhaust)
- 400 Block Vermont unsafe speeding from offramp down to 17<sup>th</sup> St.


#### What kinds of solutions do we propose?


- Bulbouts and enlarged sidewalks to increase safety
- Beautification of San Bruno / 17<sup>th</sup> Street / Vermont pedestrian and bike experience to increase activation.
- Additional green areas for sitting, walking, enjoying vegetation and view
- Art experiences to increase activation
- Green Fences to protect community from freeway
- Removal of Lane on Vermont to provide traffic calming

Dogpatch & Potrero Hill GBD with a PW Adopt-a-Highway permit



# What has the PGP SC been up to?

#### **No Bionic Contract**

**PGR SC Meeting** - after trying with SFPA no resolution is found. Team decides to reduce limit of work and focus on Potrero Gateway Park.

#### **Landscape Designer?**

Jean and JD Beltran talk with Jeff Miller exploring whether the Miller Company would be interested in taking on the project since we no longer have Bionic.

### Discuss w/ GBD

Jean, JD Beltran and Julie Christensen discuss the project directions with Jeff Miller. It is agreed that Miller Co will contract to help with Limit of Work description if the PGR SC agrees. The committee would work with Miller.

#### Limit of Work V1

PGP SC Meeting - met at Miller's office and worked to define the Limit of Work based on V1 Miller had prepared. Miller produces a V2 for the group to review and discuss/update.



Working with Bionic, working with community, creating conceptual design, finding funding, getting a PW manager, City RFP, Scope of Work completed, STC not signed.

Jean and JR Eppler meet with Julie Christensen and explain the Phase 1 direction the steering committee has decided to take



**PGP SC Meeting** - discusse options and decide to sign a contract with Miller in order to document the Limit of Work . PGP SC agreed to fund the contract.

PGP SC Meeting - review and update Limit of Work V2 at Jean's house. Prepare notes to send back to Miller

Years of outreach to improve the 101 right-of-way area on San Bruno, 17<sup>th</sup> and Vermont has resulted in a partnership with city agencies and private enterprises in order to design and build an urban park in the heart of the eastern neighborhoods







# **Cross - Sections**




1 San Bruno Avenue - South
